Congratulations to all 4 who were voted in.

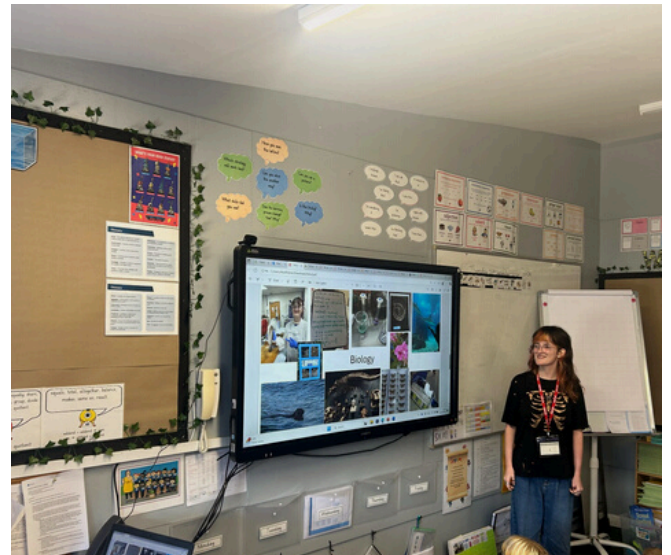

The project will focus on strengthening knowledge, skills and improving environments to better meet the needs of neurodivergent children. We are delighted to be working with the PINS Project.

READING DIARIES

They're back! You spoke; we listened. Boomreader was not as popular as hoped, so we are back to tried-and-tested homework diaries.

Please make sure that you record when you read with your child (and older children record when they have read alone) at home so that staff can keep track on the amount of reading each child is doing. Rewards are there for children who do lots of reading at home!

DRESS CODE

The start of the school year is a great time to remind parents / carers about school uniform. Our school uniform consists of:

- Royal blue sweatshirt, round neck with school badge, or
- Royal blue hooded pullover, with school badge, or
- Royal blue cardigans, v-neck with school badge (one of the above is required)
- Black or grey shorts / trousers / skirts / tunics (required)
- White shirts or polo-shirts / blouses (required)

Year 6 children are also permitted to wear their leavers hoody. Please can parents ensure that children are only wearing school hoodies.

Children should come to school wearing their PE kit on PE days to maximise learning time. In PE, the children should wear a red t-shirt and short / tracksuit trousers. Please ensure the children also wear a hoody / tracksuit top in the colder months.

Please ensure that all items are labelled clearly. Branded uniform can be purchased through [Motif8](#) whilst second hand uniform can be bought from the PTA.

PERSONAL, SOCIAL, HEALTH & ECONOMIC EDUCATION

This half-term, the children will be looking at Being Me In My World. They will be thinking about rights and responsibilities, pride in themselves, rewards and consequences and lots more.

JEWELLERY

If pupils have pierced ears, ONE pair of discreet studs may be worn.

NYCC policy states that earrings must be removed for PE lessons for health and safety reasons. If your child is unable to remove the earrings themselves, they should not wear them to school on PE days. NYCC policy states that children are not allowed to take part in PE lessons with earrings even if they are covered in tape.

Any other type of jewellery (hooped / dangly earrings, necklaces, bracelets etc.) are not permitted, unless they carry religious meaning, in which case please contact the school office.

SAFEGUARDING

We would like to make parents aware of the Monkey app, a video-chat platform where users are randomly connected to strangers. While it markets itself as a way to “make new friends,” it has been linked to inappropriate and harmful content, including the risk of children being exposed to explicit material and unwanted contact from adults.

The app has very limited safety controls, making it unsafe for children. We strongly advise parents to check devices regularly and speak with their child about only using age-appropriate, safer platforms.

BEFORE & AFTER SCHOOL CLUBS

We are proud to offer excellent wraparound care.

- Before School Club runs from 7:30am until the start of school (£6 per session)
- After School Club runs from 3:15–4:30pm (£8) or 3:15–6:00pm (£12)

Both clubs are run by our dedicated staff team. Children enjoy snacks, toys, arts and crafts, and for older children, access to a games room. If you'd like to book a place or find out more, please contact the school office.

LEARNING AT HOME

To support learning beyond the classroom, all children have access to:

- Numbots – to build number fluency (mainly KS1)
- Times Tables Rock Stars (TTRS) – to practise and speed up recall of multiplication facts
- Century – personalised practice in maths, reading and grammar for KS2
- Spelling Shed – fun games and challenges to secure weekly spellings

We encourage children to use the online learning platforms regularly at home.

PARKING

Please can parents / carers remember to park considerately when dropping children off and picking them up. It is important that enough space is left for emergency service vehicles to be able to pass by cars if necessary.

Please do not drive into school unless there is an emergency, this includes parking in the small car park at the bottom of the drive. Please remember that there are children present at the start and end of the school day.

COMMUNICATION WITH SCHOOL

School use different lines of communication for different purposes, as a reminder they are:

- School PING – messages to large groups of parents / carers e.g. newsletter, information about clubs or a letter about a trip.
- Class Dojo – direct communication between teachers and the parents / carers of their class e.g. class newsletters, direct messages to and from parents.
- Facebook / Instagram – sharing good news, interesting things that have happened and advertising upcoming events with the wider school community.
- admin@hrps.school – the main school email address. Parents should use this email address for general enquiries, contacting Mr Johnson, letting school know about absences (the phone is also an option for this) or letting school know if you need to change pickup arrangements.

Important: If you are letting us know about collection arrangements for your child or about an absence, please email or call the school office directly so they can let the right people know.

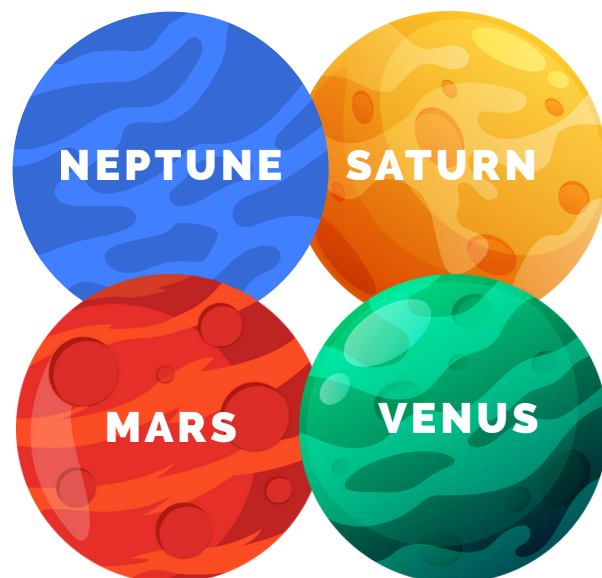
