Developing

1a. Max is correct because there is an extra comma after 'turn'. The sentence should be: Traffic lights turn red, amber and green.

2a. With my chips I like salt, vinegar and ketchup.

3a. There should be a comma between 'Tim' and 'Oli' to separate the items in the list. The correct sentence is: Tim, Oli and Mark went to the football match.

Expected

4a. Joanne is correct because 'and' should go after 'grandma' not a comma. The sentence should be: Mia liked to visit her nan, grandad, grandma and uncle.

5a. Various answers, for example: My favourite foods are strawberries, chocolate, chicken and pizza.

6a. There should not be a comma before the word 'jazz'. 'Jazz' is the last item in the list so instead of a comma, there should be the word 'and'. The correct sentence is: Seth likes to listen to pop, rap, rock and jazz music.

Greater Depth

7a. Andy is incorrect because commas have been used to separate items on a list and the last two items are separated by the word 'and'.

8a. Various answers, for example: Stan made chocolate brownies, sausage rolls, carrot cake and chicken wings for the party.

9a. There should be a comma after 'read books'. There should be the word 'and' after 'swim in the sea'. The correct sentence is: Lucy likes to play table tennis, read books, make sandcastles and swim in the sea.

Developing

1b. Abdul is incorrect because the comma has been used to separate two items on a list.

2b. My favourite desserts are ice cream, jelly and pie.

3b. There should be a comma between 'pink' and 'blue' to separate the items in the list. The correct sentence is: There are pink, blue and orange marbles on the floor.

Expected

4b. Mila is incorrect because commas have been used to separate items on a list and the last two items are separated by the word 'and'.

5b. Various answers, for example: My favourite sports are tennis, hockey, rugby and golf.

6b. The word 'and' is in the incorrect place. It should come before the word 'brown' which is the last item in the list. The correct sentence is: Autumn leaves are red, orange, yellow and brown.

Greater Depth

7b. Simone is correct because there is a comma after 'polar bear' which is not needed as it is the last item on the list. The sentence should be: Tom saw an African parrot, a red panda, a snow leopard and a polar bear at the zoo.

8b. Various answers, for example: Pam bought an electronic keyboard, a silver bracelet, a pair of skates and a coffee table from the shop.

9b. There is a comma between every word in the list instead of every group of words. The correct sentence is: Billy washes the car, cleans the dishes, mows the lawn and sweeps up leaves.
