Composer of the Week – John Williams

John Williams - (born February 8, 1932) is an American composer, conductor, and pianist and is probably one of the greatest film composers of all time. Williams has composed for many popular movies, including the Star Wars Saga, Schindler's List, Close Encounters of the Third Kind, Superman, E.T. the Extra-Terrestrial, the Indiana Jones Franchise, the Home Alone films, the first two Jaws films, the first two Jurassic Park films, Hook, and the first three Harry Potter Films.
