We can combine these words so they make sense and mean something, like this:

The children went to the park.

This is called a sentence.







Linking Words

The children went to the park.

What can you notice about the start and end of the sentence?


There is always a **capital letter** at the start of a sentence and a **full stop** at the end.

The words in a sentence need to have **finger spaces** between them so the sentence can be easily read.


















What is wrong with this sentence?

MydogiscalledBertie.

There are no spaces between the words!

My dog is called Bertie.

Now the sentence is much easier to read. We can tell where one word ends and another one starts.












You are going to work on your own to make some super sentences.

Swap whiteboards and check your partner has written a correct sentence.












