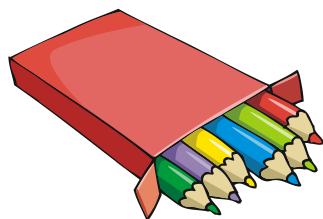


MIXED MEDIA

Combine art materials together to make something new and unexpected!

In visual art, 'mixed media' is an artwork in which more than one type of medium has been used. "Medium" means paint, crayons, clay, or anything from which art can be made. Mixed Media is a term for combining two or more of these materials to create something new. For example, you can add sculpture to your painting, or use paint, crayon, and marker in the same piece.

The first modern artwork to be considered mixed media is Pablo Picasso's 1912 collage *Still Life with Chair Caning*, which used paper, cloth, paint and rope. Other famous artists to use this technique include Andy Warhol, Edgar Degas, Jasper Johns, and Paul Klee.



TYPES OF MIXED MEDIA

COLLAGE

(paper, glue and paint on canvas)

FOUND OBJECT ART

(weave natural items into yarn)

MIXED MEDIA PAINTING

(watercolrs and oil pastels)

MIXED MEDIA SCULPTURE

(glue, found objects, paper, and paint)

PAPER CRAFT

(glue, paper, markers)

ASSEMBLAGE

(found objects like soil, rags and twigs)

WET AND DRY MEDIA

(paint and collage or fabric)
