

Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> March 2021: World Book Day 'Snuggle up and share a story' Timetable

Class: Year 3 Book: The Lion the Witch and the Wardrobe – C.S.Lewis

Here is your suggested timetable for World Book Day which reflects what we will be doing in school. Feel free to join in with these activities or do something of your own! You do not need to do all of these activities, they are just suggestions for you to pick and choose from.

Morning 1	<p><u>Share a story – The Lion the Witch and the Wardrobe – C.S.Lewis</u> In school Miss Clark will share this story with the class – Please see our website for a video of Miss Clark reading the final chapter of 'The Lion the Witch and the Wardrobe' to share with your child or alternatively if you have the book, read it snuggled up together!</p> <p><u>Narnia Treasure Hunt</u> "Well, sir, if things are real, they're there all the time." "Are they?" said the Professor' Look around your house or go for a walk, what evidence of Narnia can you find? (Scavenger Hunt list on website)</p>
Morning 2	<p><u>Create your own Shoe Box Narnia</u> "This must be a simply enormous wardrobe!" thought Lucy' Using a shoe box make a wardrobe door out of the lid and then create your own magical world inside! It could be the snowy woods of Narnia, the Castle at Cair Paravel on the Eastern Sea or your own magical land!</p>
Afternoon 1	<p><u>Make Tea for Mr Tumnus</u> "It's just around the corner, and there'll be toast, and sardines, and cake..." When I was much younger than I am now I used to make myself a little tea party as if I was really Lucy having tea with Mr Tumnus – I didn't dare try sardines, so tuna on toast is a good substitute! Make your own tea party to enjoy with your family (and Mr Tumnus)</p>
Afternoon 2	<p><u>Hide and Seek</u> "Let's play hide and seek! Susan, you're it!" Have a game of hide and seek, you might want to check the wardrobes in your house to see if Narnia reveals itself to you! But remember, don't shut the door as it is very foolish to shut oneself into a wardrobe.</p> <p><u>World Book Day Assembly with Miss Martin</u> Please see our website for a link to this assembly</p>
Throughout the day	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Create one of the gifts the gifts that Father Christmas gives the children – It could be Peter's sword or shield, Susan's bow or horn or Lucy's dagger or potion bottle.</li><li>• Design your own suit of armour for King Peter to fight in the battle against the White Witch.</li><li>• What treat would have got you to go back to Narnia like Edmund? Try making Turkish delight, or your favourite treat that would've tempted you!</li><li>• You could watch the BBC version of the story.
