

Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> March 2021: World Book Day 'Snuggle up and share a story' Timetable

Class: Year 4 Book: James and the Giant Peach, Roald Dahl

Here is your suggested timetable for World Book Day which reflects what we will be doing in school. Feel free to join in with these activities or do something of your own!

Morning 1	<p><u>Share a story</u> – Miss Templeman will be reading Chapter 11 and 12 of 'James and the Giant Peach' to the children in school. Year 4 will be focusing on this story in our live lessons all week following up to World Book Day, so the children should be aware of the story so far. Please see our website for the video of Miss Templeman reading this extract to watch at home or alternatively you could snuggle up and read this together if you have the book!</p> <p><u>Bug Hunt!</u> If you are going on a walk today with an adult or playing in your back garden, can you go on a bug hunt looking for some creepy crawlies from the book? You may need to carefully search under logs and rocks! Take some pictures or draw a picture of your findings!</p> <p>If you have REALLY enjoyed searching for bugs, you could make a bug hotel for your creatures to live! You may want to research the best conditions for the creepy crawlies in your garden.</p>
Morning 2	<p><u>Fruity fun!</u> As we are focusing on 'James and the Giant Peach' today, think about your favourite fruit. Imagine if you discovered a giant piece of your favourite fruit in your back garden, the same size as your house! What would be inside? If you crawled inside this giant piece of fruit, what would you see? Draw a giant-sized piece of fruit and doodle what you may find inside... Remember, there is no right or wrong answer, you can doodle as many fun ideas as you like!</p> <p>In school we are going to be making fruit skewers with a melted chocolate dip, you could do the same! If you're feeling creative, you could bake something with your favourite fruit included. For example, you could bake delicious banana bread. Please make sure you have an adult with you for this activity.</p>
Afternoon 1	<p><u>Research Task</u> Can you research the creatures we have just met in the story? You may want to use books or you could use whichever piece of technology you are lucky enough to have at home! You can research all of these creatures or you may just want to focus on one, for example a lady bird!</p> <p>You may research: What do the creatures look like in real life? Do they have any special features or abilities? What do they usually eat? Can you find any fun facts about these creatures? Look at pictures of the creatures in the story compared to the creatures in real life. Do they have any similarities or differences?</p>
Afternoon 2	<p><u>Protect the Peach!</u> Miss Templeman has set you the challenge of protecting the precious peach!
