Message from Mr Kelly

This time last year, school had been transformed into a NYCC HUB school for children not just from our school, but for children from any local school whose parents needed key worker support. To me it really feels like yesterday, and I thank our whole school community, children, parents, governors and of course all the staff for helping not only me but each other throughout the last year. With that being said, we are determined to make up for lost time. The children have come back to school ready to learn. I have been so impressed with their attitudes to learning and the way in which they have embraced the changes in school and the numerous daily interventions they have received. I am conscious that people are already talking about who their child's class teacher will be in September. This year has certainly been a tough one for everyone from a mental health perspective. Therefore, we have decided to once again dust down our walking boots and embark upon another charity walk raising money for mental health and the Russ Devereux Headlight Project. As part of our training for the National 3 Peaks challenge we completed the Yorkshire 3 Peaks challenge, walking approximately 24 miles ascending the 3 highest mountains in Yorkshire, Wharfedale, Ingleborough and Pen y Ghent. On Saturday 18th September, Mr Johnson, Miss Martin, Miss Palmer, Miss Templeman, Mr Beckwith, Mrs Freeman, Mrs Marriner and myself are going to complete the Yorkshire 6 peak challenge, taking on the Yorkshire 3 Peak challenge back to back within 24 hours. A mere 48 miles walking a combined incline of 15,000 feet. Everyone is invited to come along for the day and spur us on and even walk one of the mountains with us. 
