Community Information Notice

It has been brought to our attention that there are regular parking concerns in close proximity of Hutton Rudby Primary School.

Please be reminded that the Highway Code states:

You **MUST NOT** drive on or over a pavement, footpath or bridleway except to gain lawful access to property, or in the case of an emergency.

DO NOT stop or park

- near a school entrance
- anywhere you would prevent access for Emergency Services
- at or near a bus stop
- opposite or within 10 meters (32 feet) of a junction, except in an authorised parking space
 - opposite a traffic island or (if this would cause an obstruction) another parked vehicle
- where the kerb has been lowered to help wheelchair users and powered mobility vehicles
 - in front of an entrance to a property
 - on a bend

Please be aware any vehicles/drivers found committing offences may be issued with a Police Traffic Offence Report (TOR). This could result in a fine or court summons.
