

Subordinating Conjunctions



Subordinating conjunctions are words that link a main clause to a subordinate clause. These conjunctions can go at the start of a sentence, or in the middle.

See p. 15 for more = about clauses.

I am staying here until Gran comes.



Using Conjunctions for Cohesion



Conjunctions can help your writing flow better — this is called cohesion. He was wet. It was raining. He wasn't cold. This doesn't flow very well.
