

Hyphenating Prefixes




Hyphens are used to join words together or add a prefix. Some words are written with hyphens so they aren't confused with similar words.

I re-sorted my papers. I resorted to walking to work.

're-sorted' means 'to sort again'. It needs a hyphen to show that it means something different from 'resorted' which means 'to turn to an undesirable option'.

Hyphens are often used if the prefix ends in a vowel and the root word begins with a vowel.
