If you want to write about something that's still happening, use the present form of 'to be' plus the main verb with 'ing' on the end.

are / am / is verb ing He is speaking to her.

'ing' verbs in the past are formed like 'ing' verbs in the present, but 'to be' has to be in the past tense.
