Class: Year 1 Book: The Rainbow Fish

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| Morning 1          | <p><u>Share a story – The Rainbow Fish</u><br/>Miss Palmer will share this story in class – Please see our website for a video of Miss Palmer reading this story to share with your child or alternatively if you have the book read it snuggled up together!</p> <p><u>Art- Create your own Rainbow Fish.</u><br/>In class the children will create their own Rainbow fish using clay and shells. We will make our fish using different techniques with clay tools and paint the shells using rainbow colours. You could create a Rainbow fish using playdough and beads or a collage using different materials. Please see the 'Art' sheet for ideas.</p> |
| Morning 2          | <p><u>Science- Create a rainbow in a jar</u><br/>In class we will learn the meaning of 'density' and how that affects how liquids mix. We will complete an experiment to explore how dense different liquids are and form a rainbow in a jar. Please see the 'Science' sheet for instructions.</p>  |
| Afternoon 1        | <p><u>Design and Technology- Create your own rainbow fruit skewer</u><br/>In class we will attach the template fish head and tail to a skewer. Please see the 'Design and Technology' sheet for the template. We will add our favourite fruit to make a delicious and colourful snack to enjoy!</p>   |
| Afternoon 2        | <p>2:00 – World Book Day Assembly<br/>PSHE- What does a good friend look like? Why is it important to share? Can you write down or discuss different ways to be a good friend. Write your ideas on a scale from the Rainbow Fish and we will put them together to show we are a team.</p>   |
