


Thursday 3rd March 2022: World Book Day 'Books that are 25 Years or Older' Timetable
Class: Year 3 Book: Charlotte's Web

Morning 1	<p><u>Share a story – Charlotte's Web</u> In school, Mrs Trevis will share this story with the class -Please see our video of Mrs Trevis reading this story to share with your child or alternatively if you have the book read it together snuggled up!</p> <p><u>Water colour webs</u> Using white card, wax crayons and water colours, we will be creating our own webs with words of kindness! See image for inspiration!</p>  <p><u>Web engineering</u> Children will work in teams to create their own spider webs within hoops that will be able to hold 'prey' (small balls). The success of the web will be defined by how much prey the web can capture and keep. So that means the web needs to catch the balls without them falling through the string or wool and onto the ground below.</p>  <p>The winning team will be the web that can catch and hold the most prey!</p>
Morning 2	<p><u>Shoebbox puppet theatre</u> We will be designing our own barnyard with Wilbur, Charlotte and Fern so we can recreate the story! You will need: a shoe box, card, various materials you can get your hands on, shredded paper for straw and lollipop sticks to make your puppet characters!</p> 

<p>Afternoon 1</p>	<p><u>A thank you letter</u></p> <p>Charlotte's Web is all about friendship and helping people when times get tough or scary. Write a thank you letter to somebody who has helped you through a tough or scary time that you remember. If you can't remember a time that was tough, write a card to a friend to thank them for always being there and let them know what makes them a great friend.</p> <p><u>Baby spider parachutes</u></p> <p>At the end of the book, Charlotte's babies parachute down into the big wide world! We will be using various materials to help our baby spiders parachute to safety!</p> <p>STEM activity For Charlotte's Web Help the baby spiders land safely with parachutes!</p> 
<p>Afternoon 2</p>	<p>2:00 – World Book Day Assembly</p> <p><u>Kindness web</u></p> <p>Pass a cotton wool thread to a friend in class and say something kind about them! You might like their hair; you might think they're good at PE or you might think of something that makes them a great friend! We are going to create a kindness spider web in our classroom!</p>
